



Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula Council Meeting Highlights February 8, 2021

The following is a summary of the proceedings of the Special Council Meeting held on February 8, 2021:

- Council approved Draft #2 of the 2021 Budget as presented. The final draft will be presented at a public meeting at the February 22, 2021 Council meeting.
- Council reviewed various potential parking areas located throughout the Municipality with the majority being in Tobermory and Lion's Head.
- The public is encouraged to comment on potential parking areas on the [Let's Talk NBP](#) online platform.
- Plans for 2021 include expanding paid parking to Lion's Head, hiring security officers on a contract to issue parking tickets and be appointed as bylaw officers, continue closing Big Tub Road, Little Cove Road and Moore Street when needed, complete a water access inventory map, and utilize Let's Talk NBP.
- The CAO was directed to obtain information from Ontario Parks and Parks Canada, discuss a proposed shuttle service in Lion's Head with the operator, and report back to Council with results of online comments.

The following is a summary of the proceedings of the Regular Council Meeting held on February 8, 2021:

- Council received a delegation from Elizabeth Thorn, Jenna McGuire, Glen Estill and Neils Monk on behalf of the Bruce Peninsula Biosphere Association inviting Council to collaborate on their sewage system program, informing Council of their electric vehicle chargers launch, and requesting that Council designate the Cabot Head Lighthouse as culturally and historically significant.
- Council received a delegation from Barry and Sue Robinson on behalf of residents of Carter Road requesting that Council resolve safety and environmental concerns regarding the municipal access at 60 Carter Road.
- Council received a report on a waste management update and waste management services review from the Public Works Manager.
- Council approved lifting the holding zone for a property on Forty Hills Road.

- Council approved a funding application for affordable housing projects.
- Council discussed the ice surface at the Arena; the Community Services Manager will speak with community groups regarding usage for the remainder of the season.
- Council will consider passage of the updated ATV and Taxi Cab by-laws at the February 22, 2021 Council meeting.
- Council approved the submission of no objection to the Niagara Escarpment Commission regarding a development permit application for a property in the former Lindsay Township.
- Council received a report from the Clerk regarding voting methods for the 2022 municipal election.
- Council approved the advertising of the Facilities Supervisor and GIS/IT Coordinator positions for the Municipality.
- The CAO presented findings of a Modernization Report.
- Council received the approved Accounts Payable Voucher for January 2021.
- Two resolutions from other municipalities were received as information.
- Councillor Golden asked the CAO to investigate implications of investing in Cabot Head Road and designating the Lighthouse as historically significant.
- Council supported correspondence from GBTEL Inc. regarding ISED's Universal Broadband Fund and Chris McConnell requesting that the Municipality support the Gravenhurst Ontario Fire College campus staying open.
- A confirmatory by-law was approved.
