



Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula Council Meeting Highlights May 25, 2021

The following is a summary of the proceedings of the Council Meeting held on May 25, 2021:

- A public meeting was held regarding File No. Z-2020-075 (Field) for property at 136 Bradley Drive and planning staff advised that the property owner is relocating their proposal and will return at a future date. The application was deferred and public concerns were noted.
- Miguel Pelletier, Bruce County, appeared before Council via Zoom and presented information on the Bruce County Master Transportation Plan.
- Council accepted cost estimates for Phases 2 and 3 of the Isthmus Bay Road Reconstruction Project and approved GSS Engineering Consultants Limited to complete the design and prepare the tender/contract documents.
- Council approved the paving of Hawthorne Drive at a cost of \$13,200 and accepted a monetary donation of \$9,000 from the residents of Hawthorne Drive to be contributed to the overall cost of work.
- Council awarded Request for Proposal RFP PW 2021-01, Roads and Sidewalks Needs Study to GM Blue Plan Limited for a cost of \$39,925.00, excluding HST.
- Council supported passage of By-law 2021-52, being a by-law to authorize an agreement between Parks Canada Agency and the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula as it relates to the acceptance of hauled sewage, at its regular meeting of June 14, 2021.
- Council supported passage of By-law No. 2021-50, to authorize an agreement between the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula and The Meeting Place for the leasing of the Municipal Facility located at 20 Centennial Drive, Tobermory Ontario, at its regular meeting of June 14, 2021.
- Council approved the use of Park Pass Project for a pilot project at McCurdy Drive parking lot for 2021.
- Council approved the resurfacing of the Lion's Head tennis court for 2022 and agreed to incorporate pickle ball courts into future Arena renovations.

- Council approved Trailer Agreements for 138 Greenough Point Road and 18 Miller Lake Road.
- Council supported a by-law to opt out of the Vacancy Rebate Program.
- Council supported the passage of By-law No. 2021-46, Bruce County File No. Z-2020-035 (Mazzotta).
- Council supported the passage of By-law No. 2021-47, Official Plan Amendment Application – L-2020-014 (Corner).
- Council received a report of the Integrity Commissioner dated April 7, 2021 and acknowledged some appendices being released to the public.
- Council supported the passage of By-law No. 2021-48, Bruce County File No. Z-2020-014 (Corner).
- Council appointed the Clerk and Detachment Commander of the Grey Bruce Ontario Provincial Police to the Community Safety Well-Being Advisory Committee and recommended passage of By-law No. 2021-53 to authorize an agreement to develop a Joint Community Safety Well-Being Plan at the June 14, 2021 Council meeting.
- Council approved a request from the OPP to provide a paid duty weekend for 8-hour shifts in the amount of \$4,080.48, funded from the COVID-19 relief fund. Not all Council members were in favour.
- Council directed staff to proceed with preparing an agreement with Parks Canada for maintenance and administration related to the Chi sin tib dek Road and Little Cove parking area.
- Council approved the waiving of fees for an annual commercial paid parking pass for the 2021 year for Parkbus.
- Council approved minutes of the Climate Action Committee.
- Under Other Business, the CAO noted that a report will be prepared for Council regarding funding for the Tobermory Water System. Staff were directed to review the resident parking pass process, specifically additional resident passes.
- Council passed a resolution as per a request from MP, Alex Ruff, regarding bringing a 3-digit suicide prevention hotline to Canada.
- Several other correspondence items were received.
- Council approved eight by-laws: a by-law authorizing the Mayor and Clerk to execute a Site Servicing/Easement Agreement With 1415757 Ontario Inc., a by-law authorizing a lease agreement with eSolutions Group (Website Provider), a Zoning By-law Amendment (Mazzotta), an Official Plan Amendment (Corner), a Zoning By-law Amendment (Corner), a by-law opting out of the Vacancy Unit Rebate Program, a by-law establishing a lease agreement with The Meeting Place, and a confirmatory by-law.
