



Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula Council Meeting Highlights August 9, 2021

The following is a summary of the proceedings of the Council Meeting held on August 9, 2021:

- Council approved a Trailer Agreement for 131 Bradley Drive.
- Council renewed the lease for the Concession Booth Operations for the Lion's Head and District Community Centre and Arena.
- Council renewed the lease for the Pro Shop Operations for the Lion's Head and District Community Centre and Arena.
- Council supported utilizing Let's Talk NBP, the Municipality's online public engagement tool, to gather public feedback regarding accessibility for the Multi-Year Accessibility Plan 2022-2026.
- Council supported passage of a by-law to amend the Zoning By-law for Bruce County File No. Z-2021-062 (Kerton/Corcoran).
- Council supported passage of a by-law to amend the Zoning By-law for Bruce County File No. Z-2021-023 (Reimer-Catteau).
- Council supported holding a public meeting on August 23, 2021, regarding the draft Short Term Accommodation By-law with passage of the by-law scheduled for September 27, 2021.
- Council directed the CAO to provide a staff report to Council with additional information regarding the Cabot Head Trail project.
- Council approved entering into an Agreement with the Bruce Peninsula Biosphere Association to prepare a Corporate/Community Climate Action Plan.
- Council supported holding a public meeting on August 23, 2021, regarding the draft Municipal Accommodation Tax By-law with passage of the by-law scheduled for September 27, 2021.
- Council approved minutes of the Ad Hoc Museum Committee and Attainable Housing Task Force.
- Council received the approved Accounts Payable Voucher for July 2021.
- Council proclaimed October 21, 2021, as the 21st annual Child Care Worker and Early Childhood Educator Appreciation Day.

- Under Other Business, Councillor Golden expressed urgency in relocating the Tobermory Daycare to a different building due to its poor condition. A delegation is scheduled for the August 23, 2021, Council meeting from the Tobermory Daycare. The CAO will email the Bluewater District School Board for an update.
- Council tentatively scheduled a Council Road Tour for Wednesday, September 15, 2021.
- Deputy Mayor Myles advised that there is an abundance of wild parsnip along Highway 6 and the Ministry of Transportation (MTO) has yet to spray this year.
- Staff were directed to prepare a report for the August 23, 2021, Council meeting outlining paid parking revenues for 2021 to date.
- The Community Services Manager advised that the new washrooms in Tobermory will be operational shortly.
- Council received several correspondence items as information.
- Council passed six by-laws: Removal of the Holding Zone By-law, By-law to Appoint Grey Sauble Conservation Authority as the Risk Management Official and Risk Management Inspector for the Municipality, By-law to Authorize an Agreement with the Minister of Agriculture, Food (Rural Economic Development Program), Zoning By-law Amendments (Kerton/Corcoran) (Reimer-Catteau), and a Confirmatory By-law.
- Following a Closed Session meeting, Mayor McIver advised that Council received an update from the Municipal Solicitor regarding the Native Land Claim.
