



Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula Council Meeting Highlights November 8, 2021

The following is a summary of the proceedings of the Council Meeting held on November 8, 2021:

- Council received a report regarding the Lion's Head and Tobermory Music Series as information.
- Council received a report with respect to the scale of costs for tax registrations.
- Council received a report regarding the Ontario Municipal Partnership Fund (OMPF) allocation for 2022 in the amount of \$1,581,900.
- Council received information relating to the preparation of the 2022 Budget and approved the proposed timetable.
- Council approved minutes of the Cemetery Committee dated October 26, 2021 and approved tree removal of a portion of the forested area known as Block B, Rows D to M, Lots 10-21, that is already surveyed at Dunks Bay Cemetery; and that Neil Golden agrees to cut the trees to a specified height and remove all timber and associated debris at no cost to the Municipality by December 31, 2021; and that a fee of \$10,000.00 dollars be considered in the 2022 Cemetery budget negotiations for stump removal, top soil and grass seed for this area.
- Council approved minutes of the Ad Hoc Museum Committee dated October 4, 2021.
- Council approved minutes of the Ad Hoc Museum Committee dated November 2, 2021; approved the funding opportunity from Heritage Canada – Museum Assistance Program (MAP) for the “reopening funding” and directed staff to submit a grant application by November 28, 2021; supported the Ad Hoc Museum Committee acting as the lead organization and submitting an Ontario Trillium Foundation grant application for the Davis log cabin concrete pad including site clearing and interior restoration of the cabin at the museum site when the application becomes available; and the cost of relocation and restoration of the exterior (for the transfer only) of the cabin is to be covered by Parks Canada.
- Council approved minutes of the Attainable Housing Task Force dated October 5, 2021.
- Council received the approved Accounts Payable Voucher for October 2021.

- Council directed staff to amend signage at the Burma Road Dock and Boat Launch to “area closed at 10:00 p.m.”.
- Council received several correspondence items as information.
- Council approved two by-laws: a by-law to establish a scale of costs pursuant to part eleven of the Municipal Act, 2022, as amended, and a confirmatory by-law.
