



Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula Council Meeting Highlights March 14, 2022

The following is a summary of the proceedings of the Council Meeting held on March 14, 2022:

- A Public Meeting was held regarding the final draft of the 2022 Budget. No public comments were received.
- A Public Meeting was held regarding the draft Parking By-law 2022-02. No public comments were received.
- Becky Smith provided an update on Municipal Innovation Council (MIC) initiatives.
- The Tobermory Chamber of Commerce discussed their proposal to be the non-profit recipient of 50% of the revenues generated through Municipal Accommodation Tax (MAT) in the Municipality.
- Council received a report from the GIS/IT Coordinator regarding the Digital Open House website. The website can be viewed at **northbrucepeninsula.ca/openhouse/**
- Council awarded a contract for the Lion's Head Harbour Roof Replacement project to A+ Roofing Canada in the amount of \$47,865.67.
- Council received a report from the By-law Enforcement Officer summarizing Parking By-law 2022-02 which is scheduled for passage on March 28, 2022.
- Council received a report from the Public Works Manager regarding an agreement with Parks Canada Agency as it relates to paving the turnaround area and roadway at the Parks Canada operated Emmett Lake Gatehouse.
- Council received a report on the 2021 Lion's Head Drinking Water System Summary Report which will be posted on the municipal website.
- Council received a report on the 2021 Lion's Head Drinking Water System and Tobermory Primary Place Daycare Centre Drinking Water System Annual Reports which will be posted on the municipal website.
- Council supported the addition of Dunn Street in the winter maintenance program commencing in the 2022/2023 winter season.
- Council received a report on the 2022 Interim Tax Levy.

- Council received a report regarding Municipal investments in 2021.
- Council received a report regarding 2021 By-law Department revenue and expenses and allocation of surplus funds to reserves.
- Council received a report outlining Council remuneration for 2021.
- Council received the Audit Planning Report from BDO Canada LLP.
- Council directed staff to submit the Municipality's position of no objection to a severance in the former Eastnor Township (Hofer).
- Council directed staff to submit the Municipality's comments to the Niagara Escarpment Commission (NEC) regarding a Development Permit application in the former Lindsay Township (Bruce Trail Conservancy/Ontario Heritage Trust).
- Council authorized the cancellation of the Regular Council meeting on April 11, 2022.
- Council received a letter from the Integrity Commissioner dated March 7, 2022 as it relates to the matter of two anonymous complaints lodged against Councillor Mielhausen. Both anonymous complaints were dismissed.
- Council approved minutes of the Attainable Housing Task Force, Climate Action Committee, and Chi-Cheemaun Festival Committee.
- Council received approved Accounts Payable Voucher, February 2022.
- Council supported a resolution from the Town of South Bruce Peninsula regarding municipal accommodation tax and crown campgrounds.
- Council received several correspondence items as information.
- Council approved five by-laws: 2022 Tax Rates, Hauled Sewage Agreement with Parks Canada Agency, Winter Service Agreement with Parks Canada Agency, Levy and Collection of 2022 Interim Tax, and Confirmatory By-law.
- Following a closed session meeting, Mayor McIver advised that Council gave direction to the CAO regarding the Native Land Claim.
