



## Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula Council Meeting Highlights May 9, 2022

The following is a summary of the proceedings of the Special Council Meeting held on May 9, 2022:

- Will Meneray and Mike Campbell presented an overview of the Climate Action Plan Summary and Technical Reports on behalf of the Climate Action Committee.
- Council committed to reducing its greenhouse gas emissions by 20% below 2020 levels for corporate operation and community activities by 2030.
- Council accepted the Climate Action Plan and directed staff to provide further information regarding the incorporation of the recommendations within the Plan.

The following is a summary of the proceedings of the Council Meeting held on May 9, 2022:

- Council approved Zoning By-law Amendment No. Z-2021-016 (Psocka).
- Council endorsed the Municipality's Health and Safety Policy Statement.
- Council received a report as information regarding the Municipal Innovation Council's Joint IT Business Analysis.
- Council directed staff to submit the Municipality's comments to the Niagara Escarpment Commission (NEC) regarding a Development Permit Application submitted by Bruce Trail Conservancy for property in the former Eastnor Township.
- Council directed staff to submit to the County of Bruce Planning and Economic Development Department the Municipality's position of no objection to an application submitted by Blue Heron Tours Inc. to amend zoning for property in the former St. Edmunds Township.
- Council directed staff to submit to the County of Bruce Planning and Economic Development Department the Municipality's position of no objection to a severance submitted by Bruce Loney for property in the former Eastnor Township.

- Council directed Administration to proceed with a public proposal process (Request for Proposals) for a shuttle service in Lion's Head from May to October 2022.
- Council approved a contract between ChargerQuest Inc. and the Municipality regarding e-charging stations in Tobermory.
- Council approved minutes of the Attainable Housing Task Force, Ad Hoc Museum Committee, and Chi Cheemaun Festival Committee.
- Council proclaimed May 17 as the International Day Against Homophobia and Transphobia.
- Council received several correspondence items as information.
- Council directed Public Works to respond to the letter regarding the blind corner on Eagle Road.
- Council discussed delegation topics for the 2022 AMO Conference.
- Council directed staff to prepare a report regarding the possible transfer of ownership of the property known as "The Rocks" at Whiskey Harbour to the Municipality.
- Council passed six by-laws: Fees and Charges By-law, Removal of the Holding Zone By-law (26 Old Woman's River Road), By-law to Repeal By-law No. 2020-40, Lease Agreement with Iron League Sports and Promotions, Zoning By-law Amendment (Psocka), and Confirmatory By-law.
- Following a closed session meeting, Mayor McIver advised that Council approved previous closed session minutes and received an information update regarding personnel matters within the Public Works Department.
