



Licensing Program Laneway Sign Requirement

Bed and Breakfast establishments are required to display the contact information of the property owner at the end of the rental laneway. For Short-Term Accommodations, the contact information for the property manager or responsible person must be displayed. This ensures that key contact details are easy to find and helps keep operations running smoothly.

Frequently Asked Questions

Is the Municipality allowed to require this information to be posted?

Yes, the Municipality can require contact information to be posted at the end of the driveway. While some people have raised privacy concerns, Council has decided to move forward with this requirement.

What if I do not want my name or my responsible person's name posted?

If you prefer not to display a personal name, you can use the name of the rental instead, followed by the contact information, for example:

Cottage by the Bay

111-222-3333

Is there a certain kind of sign that is required to be installed?

You don't need a specific type of sign—you could put one on a post, attach a magnet to your Bear Bin, nail it to a tree, or get creative in another way. The important thing is that the sign is easy to read, clearly shows who to contact, and is displayed whenever the dwelling is being rented. Some examples of signs are shown below to help get you started.
